
# The Friends of the Paw Paw District Library Fall 2024 Newsletter

Nerds unite! **Geek Fest** returns to the Kalamazoo County Expo Center on **October 12** from **11 am – 3 pm**. **Geek Fest** is a free, all-ages celebration of geek culture in all its forms! Comics and art, table top games, technology, cosplay, and meet our special guest actor Tim Downie!

Downie has worked on films such as awardwinning *The King's Speech*, *Paddington*, *War Machine*, *Transformers: The Last Knight*, and much more. Other television work includes *Outlander*, *Toast of London*, *Chewing Gum*, *Upstart Crow* and more. He can currently be seen on Netflix with *Geek Girl* and Amazon Prime's *Good Omens 2* and the film *Nandor Fodor and the Talking Mongoose* with Simon Pegg and Minnie Driver.

Last year was his gaming debut playing everyone's favorite wizard, Gale Dekarios in *Baldur's Gate 3*, a game set in a world by fantasy tabletop role-playing system *Dungeons & Dragons*. *Baldur's Gate 3* won 32 awards last year including, BAFTA Game of the Year, Game Developers Choice Awards, Golden Joystick Awards, PC Gamer and more.

#### Paw Paw District Library's Dedicated Prairie Land Supports Environmental Balance

When the current Paw Paw District Library was completed in 2011 it was intended to better suit the needs of not only our community but also our rapidly changing environment. The building itself is LEED certified (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design; a globally recognized certification focused on sustainability and resource efficiency) and is surrounded by dedicated prairie land.

Why is prairie land important? Prairies consist of native plants with deep roots that aid in water conservation. The roots of these native plants reach far into the soil, thereby slowing down the flow of water. These root systems prevent soil erosion, maintain the water table and aid in flood control.

Another important aspect of prairie land is the diverse ecosystem it provides. This ecosystem supports pollinators such as bees, birds, small mammals, butterflies and beetles. Pollinators are essential to the continuation of not just native plants but also food crops. By providing dedicated prairie land our local library offers a safe, pesticidefree environment for the often underappreciated yet vitally important insect population.

Improved soil health and air quality are some of the many benefits of dedicated prairie land. The same deep roots that aid in water conservation improve soil health by aerating the soil, increasing organic matter content and promoting nutrient cycling. And because the need for mowing on prairies is minimal, emissions are, in turn, reduced, further lowering our much-loved Library's carbon footprint.

To summarize, the dedicated prairie surrounding the Paw Paw District Library is not only visually diverse but also something for our community to be proud of. Prairie plots are essential to support the biodiversity of Southwest Michigan. When frequenting our lovely Library we hope you enjoy the array of carefully chosen native wild grasses, lupine, coneflowers, spiderwort, bergamot, chicory, butterfly weed and hoary vervain, to name a few.





Our group now maintains two Little Free Libraries in Paw Paw. The original box (above) is located outside Paw Paw Brewing Company (780 S. Gremps St.). More recently a second box (below) was installed between the Paw Paw Village Hall and the Strand Theater (~113 E. Michigan Ave.).



#### **Explore Little Free Libraries**

Little Free Library is a nonprofit organization which promotes access to books via a global network of volunteers. According to their website (*littlefreelibrary.org*), "a Little Free Library is a free book-sharing box where anyone may take a book or share a book. They function on the honor system. You do not need to share a book in order to take one. If you take a book or two from a little library, try to bring some to share to that same library, or another in your area, when you can." Check out one of the many such book-sharing boxes in our area!



**Borrow a Book from MeLCat!**

Do you know how to borrow library books from the Michigan interlibrary loan system? MeLCat is the Michigan eLibrary, a 24/7 online library for Michigan residents. The system was set up by the Library of Michigan, using Federal grant money and offering access to library materials from all over Michigan. You need a resident library card from the local library where you reside. Patrons living in the Paw Paw School District are entitled to borrow MeLCat books through the Paw Paw District Library.

To borrow a book that is not available at PPDL, either order it online from MeLCat, or get help from a PPDL librarian in ordering the book from MeLCat. Use the online address *elibrary.mel.org* and be prepared to enter the number of your library card, and to click on the name of Paw Paw District Library from a list of participating libraries. If the book is available (you will be able to see if it is available) it will be delivered to PPDL in one or two weeks. The book is checked out for four weeks. Databases are available for kids, teens, and adults. In 2023 PPDL borrowed 1948 items and loaned 1995 items through MeLCat. The system includes 400 Michigan libraries, including colleges and universities. This gives you lots of sources for that book you've been meaning to read!
